## **INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE DIRECTORS OF SCHRODER INVESTMENT MANAGEMENT LIMITED AND SCHRODER & CO. LIMITED**

### **Opinion**

We have audited the country-by-country schedule and notes 1 to 3 to the schedule (together 'the Schedule') of Schroder Investment Management Limited and Schroder & Co. Limited ('the Companies') for the year ended 31 December 2018.

In our opinion the accompanying country-by-country information, labelled as audited in the Schedule, of the Companies as at 31 December 2018, is prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with the requirements of The Capital Requirements (Country-by-Country Reporting) Regulations 2013 ('the Regulations').

### **Basis for Opinion**

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (UK) (ISAs (UK)). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Schedule* section of our report below. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.
